Cimini spoke of a recent court case order that was issued last week. There can be no more amending agendas at a meeting unless:

- 1. Emergency
- 2. Nominal value and it has to have occurred in the past 24 hours
- 3. Resident/taxpayer brings it up and it is no contractor or spending.

They released the catch all exception.

Cimini announced that the tentative date for the Carbon Sequestration presentation with Archaea Energy will be December 7, 2023 at 6:00 pm (tentatively).

Audience Comments:

Tom Lukasewicz, George St.: Suggested not advertising on Mondays because there are no physical newspapers delivered on Mondays.

Lukasewick also spoke of the upcoming presentation with Archaea. Would like Council to research and educate as much as possible. Basically, something new and never done close to a town and close to proximity of a landfill. Almost like a deep well injection done away from residential areas to put contaminants from like the drilling sites and I think we really need to research it. Have to remember radon gas comes up from deep within shale and there are a lot of issues with radon gas. Question, leachate must be discharged somewhere. Leachate goes to sewer treatment plant in Scranton and the fees are high. Has there been discussions to bring the stormwater into lines in Throop and the river? The stormwater or leachate – DEP and landfills currently address leachate like clear as water. If it happens, will it go into a sanitary line and into sulfer creek and then in to the Lackawanna River?

Kucharski added that there has been no discussion regarding stormwater.

Cimini suggested that anyone who has not been to the landfill to go through the reverse osmosis plant should. The 2 formal applications considered were for eddy creek and little roaring brook. It was quickly realized that eddy creek wasn't going to work so from what I understand there is a pending application for a discharge into little roaring brook based on the quality of the leachate once through the reverse osmosis system to be discharged into a waterway it has to be pretty clean. Not a decision that we would make. Right now into little roaring brook and has been for the past 2 plus years. There hasn't been a decision on little roaring brook.

Lukasewicz really didn't want it going through Throop.

Cimini suggested Lukasewicz go to the landfill to go through the reverse osmosis plant.

The meeting was adjourned.
